

In today's Gospel, we meet a man giving out talents to his servants, each in accordance with his ability. God our father bestows upon each one of us his gifts.

In the Mass today - this sacred meal - we respond in thanksgiving for God's graces, god's blessings. A weekday preface at Mass reminds us - "You, God, have no need of our praise, yet our desire to thank you is itself your gift."

As we pray in our Penitential Rite, we recall our failures to respond to the gifts of God, by reaching out to the needs of others. We ask the mercy of God for what we have failed to do.

From the Book of Proverbs:

The virtues of the 'perfect wife' are recounted for us. It is an illustration of the power of any person to do good or evil. What matters is that she does all that she has to as one who respects the Lord and recognises the value of his gifts to her. She is industrious at home - she witnesses to the needs of the poor.

The Psalm:

The Psalm tells us that the 'fear of God' is the beginning of a happy family life, Fear means respect, wonder and awe in the presence of God. We have no heed to be afraid.

From the letter of Paul to the Christians at Thessalonika:

We cannot put off our conversion until tomorrow. Tomorrow may be too late - The Day of Judgement and Accountability will come when we least expect it.

The Gospel:

Matthew tells us of how three servants invested their talents, Jesus is not concerned with who has the greatest talents but rather how each person uses those they have been given.

THIRTY - THIRD SUNDAY OF THE YEAR - YEAR A

Christ has called us to witness to him in our daily lives by the way we fulfil our every-day tasks. Now we ask God to grant us the wisdom to know how best to do this and the courage to follow his way, and to see more clearly his guidance.

- 1. May we value the gift of faith, which gives meaning to our lives. May we invite God into our lives each day by prayer, the sacraments and Christian living.
- 2. We pray for leaders throughout the world that they may work for the elimination of injustice, poverty and unemployment.
- 3. We pray for those who have not yet found the strength to follow Christ may he grant them a special gift of courage.
- 4. We pray for all those who use their gifts in the service of others in difficult or dangerous situations. May they be blessed by God to persevere. 5. We pray for the sick those who are troubled those who despair of life.
- May they be comforted with the Lord's presence and peace.

 6. We pray for all the dead especially the innocent victims. May all be brought to the Kingdom of Peace and Life.
- 7. Mary is the Mother of the Lord of Life. We ask her prayers Hail Mary 8. '0 blessed are they who fear the Lord'. We pause to reflect on our love for God.

God our Father you desire that all people should come to the knowledge of the truth of the Gospel of your Son, Jesus Christ. Renew our faith, our hope, our love, so that we may play our part in making him known in our world today. May we always use our gifts and our talents in the service of the One who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life, for he lives and reigns with you, the Father, and the Holy Spirit, one God, our God, for ever and ever. Amen.
