### Message from Fr Peter

The Pope's annual 'Season of Creation' begins on 1st September and ends on 4th October - the feast day of Saint Francis of Assisi, the patron of Ecology. His joy at relating to the human and natural worlds as one common home - with Jesus joining them - is echoed by the English mystic Dame Julian of Norwich. She interprets Christ's life, death and resurrection, as enwrapping all that exists in a vision she received:

"God showed me a little thing, the size of a hazelnut in the palm of my hand, and it was as round as a ball. I looked at it with the eye of my understanding and thought what can this be? And it was generally answered thus: it is all that is made. I marvelled how it could continue, because it seemed to me it could certainly have sunk into nothingness because of its littleness. And I was answered in my understanding: it continueth and always shall, because God loveth it; and in this way everything hath its being by the love of God".

This is the embrace which binds us and nature together "yesterday, today and forever" (Hebrews 13,8) St Joseph's, Canley and Warwick University

## ST JOHN FISHER: COLLECTING CONTACT DETAILS OF THOSE WHO COME TO CHURCH FOR NHS TRACK AND TRACE

For the safety of all who attend Mass, the government has advised that a contact phone number be kept for everyone who comes to Mass, for a period of 21 days. That information will be destroyed after 21 days. It will be made available to NHS Track and Trace if they contact the parish to request that information. It will only be made available to any third party if that is required by law.

If you come to Mass in a group or as a family only one contact number will be needed.

The legal basis on which the parish will hold this information is your consent. If you do not wish to provide your phone number for these purposes, you will still be able to attend Mass.

The parish is committed to ensuring that information we hold about you is properly and securely held in accordance with the law. You can find out more from our Privacy Notice, which is at https://www.birminghamdiocese.org.uk/privacy-policy. This parish is part of the Archdiocese of Birmingham, registered charity number 234216.

Your contact details will be required for every Mass you attend. If a family attend, one contact number is sufficient. Please put your details on a piece of paper (or print off a form from the Parish website) and place in the basket provided at the start of each Mass.

A basket will be provided for the completed slips for each Mass and these will be kept securely for 21 days in case NHS Track and Trace require details. After 21 days the slips will be destroyed.

### Health and Safety Guidance in a time of Covid 19

There are special guidelines for each setting we go into. These are based upon agreed Archdiocesan and Government guidance applied to our circumstances. These guidelines will be reviewed again by Fr Des when he comes as parish priest.

#### Those Attending Mass or a Service

- Must wear a mask. The government has now made it **mandatory**, in places of worship, for people to wear a mask or face covering (except those with medical conditions, disabilities and other impairments which prevent them from doing so). Children under 11 are exempt.
- Sanitise hands at entry and exit- Maintain a social distance of 2m
- Follow a Steward's instructions and any signs
- Recognise that only the priest is allowed in the sacristy or sanctuary area.
- Realise that the priest is unable to greet you as he usually does.
- Church space is limited to 60. Give others the chance to come to mass too.
- Remember that the toilets are not available to be used.

#### **Changes During Mass**

At present, we won't be having any:

- Altar Servers, Readers, Eucharistic Ministers, Choir nor individual Singing (or raised voices)
- Collections during Mass because we can't pass baskets around to receive weekly offerings, these are at entry/exit points
- You will be invited to sit or kneel at various times in the Mass please do whichever feels most comfortable for you.

#### **Holy Communion**

- Please stay seated until a steward directs you towards the altar via the central aisle.
- Keep your mask/face covering on
- Receive the host, silently, with outstretched hands
- Consume the host as you return to your seat via the outer aisles.
- Don't be embarrassed if you don't feel able to receive at this time -for whatever reason please come for a Blessing or bow to the tabernacle as you leave.

#### General Advice

Please stay at home if you:

- have been told to Shield
- have been exposed to Covid 19
- have a family member who is sick
- feel unwell yourself

## An Appeal for Stewards and Cleaners

As you can imagine in order for us to continue to fulfil the complex health and safety guidelines, we will need many more stewards and cleaners. We only have a small group at present. Do consider whether your health and age would allow you to offer to help. Contact the Church through the office website for further details.

#### Confessions

At the moment there will continue to be no Confessions, but Fr Des will review this when he comes in the near future. Further details will be given in the newsletter nearer the time. In circumstances like lockdown, or when a person can't attend church, or a priest is not able to hear the large number of confessions that may be required, the Catechism and Pope Francis, recommend a Prayer of Perfect Contrition to obtain the forgiveness of our sins. This also includes our mortal ones- if we aim to go to confession when we can. The Bishops, in line with this teaching, ask us to say: "My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good. I have sinned against you, whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin."
