PRAYER OF DEDICATION OF OUR PARISH

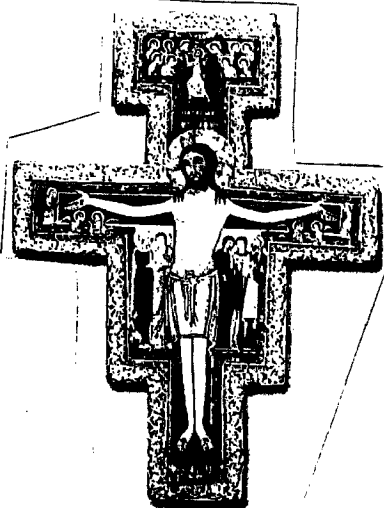
God our Father, as a Parish this day we re-dedicate our whole lives to the service of your Church. With confidence, we present our heartfelt prayers to You. We ask you to bless this Parish Community, our homes, our families. Strengthen with your peace all our days. We commend ourselves to the protection of Mary, our Lady, the Mother of Jesus, Mother of the Church. Through her prayers may we be preserved from all evil influences, now and at the hour of our death. This prayer we ask in the Name of Jesus who lives and reigns with you, the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen

THE SIGN OF THE CROSS –

is the Christian's logo or symbol. From the very beginning at Baptism, when priests and parents sign a baby on the forehead, to the last farewell - again the sign of the Cross - over our coffin. It signifies that the person making or receiving it belongs to the Father, to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit - to the Trinity, in short. Often it's used so mindlessly and indiscriminately that we seldom think of what we are doing. We're too busy waiting for the sermon, the meal, the 'real' prayer that follows, that we don't notice that we have said the most powerful prayer already. Properly done, in wordless movement, it expresses a great deal. You firstly touch your head, dedicating your mind to God, as you say 'In the name of the Father'. Secondly, you touch the base of your heart, the symbol of love, while we speak the name of the One who loved us first: 'and the Son'. Thirdly you move from shoulder to shoulder, from which our arms spring, the agents of action, as we say 'and of the Holy Spirit'. With the sign of the Cross, we indicate whom we belong to. By this blessing, with this simple sign and these simple words, we show we are no longer our own man or woman. Whatever follows - the prayer I pray, the meal I eat, the journey I take, the job I do, the journey I start, you do them not in your name and for your glory, but in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. You are never alone: three's company. In full authority, Jesus summoned the apostles to the mountain the traditional place of God's revelation. In reverence they bowed down before Him as they received his command to go into the world to preach and to baptise all people in the name of the Trinity. His promise to be with them is still realised today in our own lives as we go forth in His Name.
